## **MESSAGE RECAP**

This week's message highlighted the rich history and theology behind the song *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.* Its origins in the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> centuries remind us of the anticipation for Christ's first coming and the hope we now hold for His return. - **3.** Rejoice in God's Promises
  - a. Read Philippians 4:4-7. What does it mean to rejoice "always," even when facing challenges?
  - b. How can rejoicing help shift your perspective in difficult circumstances?
- 4. The Mission of Jesus
  - a. Read Luke 4:18-19. How does Jesus' mission to set captives free and restore the broken inspire you today?
  - b. In what ways have you experienced freedom or healing through Christ?
- 5. Hope for the future
  - a. Read John 14:1-3 and Revelation 22:20. How does the promise of Jesus' return encourage you?
  - b. How can you prepare your heart for the day Jesu comes again?
