Matthew 5:31-32

## **MESSAGE RECAP**

This week's message continues through the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus speaks to those who are blessed, not the religious elite, and emphasizes a righteousness that surpasses legalistic adherence to rules. He provides six examples where he contrasts traditional understandings with a deeper, heart-centered approach. In this sermon, we explore Jesus' teaching on divorce, particularly focusing on Matthew 5:31-32. Jesus addresses the crowd, emphasizing a kingdom mindset that goes beyond mere adherence to laws and touches the heart of human relationships and intentions.

- **3.** Read Matthew 5:31 and <u>Deuteronomy 24:1</u> What are some ways rabbis were interpreting "something indecent" at that time?
- **4.** Read Matthew 5:32 and Matthew 19:3-9. What stands out to you in Jesus' teaching on divorce? In what ways is Jesus challenging the cultural norms of his time regarding women in divorce?
- **5.** How does Jesus' perspective on marriage and divorce reflect God's character and His relationship with us?
- **6.** In what ways can we, as a small group, encourage and support each other in relationships?
