01) AND YOU THINK YOUR FAMILY IS CRAZY

Genesis 37

MESSAGE RECAP

This week's message dives into the story of Joseph from Genesis 37, focusing on the dysfunctional family dynamics that shaped his early life. Joseph, the favorite son of Jacob, is resented by his brothers due to their father's blatant favoritism and Joseph's own lack of tact. Despite the dysfunction and betrayal, this week's message emphasizes God's larger plan, even when it's not immediately visible. The story encourages us to trust in God's redemptive purpose, even in the midst of our own family struggles or personal pain.

- 1. After listening to the message, what stood out to you?
- 2. Think of a time when you felt like you were treated unfairly. How did you react, and what did you learn from the situation?
- **3.** Read <u>Genesis 37:3-4.</u> How does favoritism affect relationships within a family or group? What steps can we take to avoid this in our homes, work, and church?
- **4.** Read Genesis 37:5-8: Have you ever had a dream or vision that others didn't understand or even resented? How did you handle their reactions?
- **5.** Joseph's brothers responded with anger. Genesis 37:23-36.
 - a. James 4:1 What internal battles or desires often lead to conflict in your life?
 - b. Ephesians 4:31 Why is it important to deal with anger and bitterness quickly? How can holding onto these emotions affect our relationships and spiritual life?
- **6.** Joseph's life took a difficult turn, but God used those challenges for His greater plan. What circumstances in your life might God be using for a greater purpose?
- **7.** Which of these three statements made in the message would you connect with most and why?
 - a. "Living with hurt is part of the journey but it's not the destination."
 - b. "Living with hurt can be lonely but you don't have to be alone."
 - c. "No matter how much it hurts now, your struggles may be the path God uses to shape your life for His glory."
