MESSAGE RECAP

In this sermon, we explore Genesis 41 and the story of Joseph interpreting Pharaoh's dreams. Joseph had been in prison for two years, enduring hardship and waiting for God's timing. This story emphasizes that God is always working, even in our waiting. Joseph's journey from a "dreamer" betrayed by his brothers to second in command of Egypt highlights God's sovereign plan, patience, and the power of humility.

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. How are you...really?
2. Have you ever had a dream that stuck with you? What do you think it meant if anything?
3. Read Genesis 41:1-8. Why do you think Joseph had to wait two more years in prison before God gave Pharaoh a dream? Can you relate to waiting for something in your own life? What might God be doing in you while you wait?
4. Read Genesis 41:9-16. Joseph could have taken credit for interpreting Pharaoh's dream, but he gave all glory to God. How can we show similar humility in our roles or responsibilities? (Luke 14:11)
5. Read Genesis 41:25-32. Have you ever had a dream interpreted in your life? If so, share details about that experience.
6. Joseph told Pharaoh that God was revealing his plans through the dreams. How does believing in God's sovereignty help us navigate uncertainty in life?
7. Waiting often feels frustrating, but what do you think God is developing in us during those times? How has waiting on God shaped your character?
