# REVELATION 4 - GROUP GUIDE

# **MESSAGE RECAP**

In Revelation 4, John steps through an open door into the throne room of heaven — a space filled with indescribable beauty, overwhelming power, perfect leadership, and unending worship. From the shimmering rainbow around God's throne to the four living creatures and twenty-four elders laying down their crowns, everything in this chapter reminds us: God reigns. All of creation exists to give Him glory. Worship isn't just what we do on Sundays — it's a daily surrender of pride, self-reliance, and comfort to the One who is worthy of all honor, glory, and power.

## **Scripture Readings:**

- Revelation 4:1–11 John's vision of heaven's throne room.
- Isaiah 6:1–4 A parallel glimpse of God's holiness and glory.
- Romans 12:1–2 Worship as a surrendered life.

# **GROUP DISCUSSION**

**1.** When's a time you walked into a place that took your breath away — maybe a stadium, a cathedral, or a natural wonder? How does that compare to what John experiences in Revelation 4?

#### 2. The Door

- a. What do you think the "door standing open in heaven" represents for John and for us?
- b. Have you ever felt like doors were closed in your life, only to realize God was opening a different one spiritually?

#### 3. The Spirit

- a. John is "in the Spirit" as he enters heaven. What does that posture of openness and worship look like for you in your everyday life?
- b. How can being "in the Spirit" change how we see what's happening around us?

#### 4. The Throne

- a. The throne appears 47 times in Revelation. Why is it so important for us to remember that God is on the throne especially when life feels chaotic?
- b. John's vision contrasts God's throne with the power of Rome. What modern "thrones" (governments, corporations, influencers, comfort, etc.) compete for our attention today?

#### 5. Worship

- a. The four creatures and twenty-four elders never stop worshipping. What do you learn from their posture and response?
- b. Worship in this scene involves laying down crowns. What are some "crowns" (achievements, possessions, reputations) that might be hardest for us to lay down before God?
- c. How does this passage reshape your understanding of worship beyond music as surrender, dependence, and offering your life to God?

#### 6. Application

- a. Personal: Take one area of your life where you're holding tight to control or pride. This week, consciously "lay it down" in prayer and ask God to reign there.
- b. Group: Spend time reflecting on what true worship looks like in your daily routines not just Sunday services. How could your group cultivate more of that rhythm together?
- c. Creative Option: Listen to or read the words of "Revelation Song" or "Is He Worthy?" and picture the throne room as you worship.

### **7. Prayer** ( Please make time for this in the group)

- a. Praise God for His beauty, power, and sovereignty.
- b. Thank Him for opening the door of heaven through Christ.
- c. Ask the Spirit to awaken hearts to deeper worship.
- d. Pray that each person in your group would live a life of surrendered, ongoing worship "laying down their crowns" before Him.
